

TfL 2010 Fares – Media Briefing Note – 15 October 2010

The 2010 fares package will come in to effect from 2 January across all TfL services.

2010 Travelcards and related Oyster pay as you go daily price caps

London Travelcard prices will be frozen in the vast majority of cases, as set out in Table 1 below. The exception will be Seven Day 2 Zone Travelcards that exclude Zone 1 travel, which will rise in line with the equivalent Bus and Tram 7 day Travelcard.

There will also be a number of changes to One Day products:

- The One Day Oyster PAYG price cap will be increase by 50p to match the current paper ticket, reflecting the fact that shortly Oyster will be valid on all national rail services within Greater London as with the current paper ticket.
- The £1 Child offpeak Travelcard for children accompanying an adult Travelcard holder will be withdrawn.
- The £1 child offpeak Oyster cap will be maintained and will provide an equivalent facility following the extension of PAYG to all national rail services within Greater London.
- The 3 day Travelcard range will be withdrawn due to low sales and the fact that the prices are generally equivalent to three One Day Oyster PAYG caps.

Cash fares on TfL Rail services – DLR, London Overground

- Following the installation of Oyster top-up vending machines at DLR stations, the “short hop” cash fare of 160p will be withdrawn. The equivalent Oyster PAYG fare will be 130p in 2010.
- On London Overground, the short hop fare will also be withdrawn along with the remaining point-to-point season tickets to bring fares fully into line with those on the Underground.
- The £3.20 zonal cash fare on TfL rail services outside Zone 1 will increase to £3.50.
- The £4.00 zonal cash fare for travel outside Zone One and the £4.00 cash fare from Zone One to Zones Five and Six will increase to £4.50.

Bus and Tram fares

Following the extension of Oyster retailing to all 4000 outlets in the Ticket Stop network, the One Day Bus & Tram Pass paper ticket will be withdrawn. The existing One Day Oyster price cap will provide an equivalent product.

TfL Rail services

Oyster PAYG – 16/17 fares

16/17s will continue to pay half rate adult PAYG fares on TfL rail services.

Oyster PAYG – 11/15 fares

11/15s in possession of an Oyster photocard will continue to pay a flat PAYG fare on TfL rail services and this will increase from 55p to 65p in January 2010. This will continue to represent half the minimum adult one zone fare.

PAYG – under 11 fares

Under 11s travel free on TfL rail services if accompanied by an adult to usher them through station gatelines or if in possession of an under 11s photocard.

The New Deal

On TfL rail services, the New Deal card holder concession will comprise half price Travelcard seasons and half price PAYG single fares and daily caps. Half rate PAYG fares will also be available to New Deal card holders on Train services. New Deal card holders will cease to be entitled to child rate One Day Travelcards but will continue to be eligible for child (half rate) single fares.

Railcard holders

Holders of 16-25, Senior, Disabled and Forces Railcards will continue to be entitled to a 34% discount on the offpeak rail caps.
